Indian summer is the term used to describe a period of abnormally warm weather in mid- or late autumn, but for it to be considered a true Indian summer, at least one killing frost and a substantial period of normally cool weather must precede the warm spell.



In 1969, approximately half of all schoolchildren, age 5 to 18, walked or bicycled to or from school, and 87 percent of those living within 1 mile of school walked or bicycled. Today, fewer than 15 percent of children and adolescents use active modes of transportation.

BE PREPARED



When preparing for a possible emergency, it is best to think first about the basic of survival: fresh water, food, clean air and warmth.

Recommend items for a Basic Emergency Supply Kit Include:

- 1 gallon of water per person per day for at least 3 days, for drinking and sanitation
- At least a 3-day supply of non-perishable food
- Battery –powered or hand crank radio and a NOAA Weather Radio with tone alert and extra batteries for both
- Flashlight and extra batteries
- First aid kit
- Whistle to signal for help
- Dust mask to help filter contaminated air and plastic sheeting and duct tape to shelter-in-place
- Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties for personal sanitation
- Wrench or pliers to turn off utilities
- Can opener for food (if kit contains canned food)
- Local maps
- Prescription medications and glasses
- Infant formula and diapers
- Pet food and extra water for pets
- Important family documents in a waterproof, portable container
- Cash or traveler's checks and change
- Sleeping bag or warm blanket for each person
